Helping Children and Families Succeed

Early Learning Centers

Provides high-quality, early childhood education for infants, toddlers, and preschool children at 5-star rated centers to prepare children for success in school. Part-day and full-day Head Start, full-day and home-based Early Head Start, and childcare options are available.

Adult New Readers

Trains volunteers as tutors to improve adults' literacy skills and teach legal immigrants English, so they may work, live productively in their community, and enhance the quality of their children's lives. Students may also receive assistance preparing for Citizenship and GED testing.

Helping Reduce Energy Costs

Emergency Home Energy Assistance Program (E-HEAP)

Assists income-eligible households with energy needs by providing financial assistance through programs like Percentage of Income Payment Plan (PIPP), Winter Crisis (WCP), and Summer Cooling (SCP).

Emergency Services

Offers emergency financial assistance to income-qualified Warren County residents for rent and utilities to avoid eviction. Assistance solves immediate, urgent, and short-term needs. Case management is provided for all emergency service customers.

Housing for Seniors & Families

Affordable Housing

Provides clean, well-maintained, and affordable housing for income-eligible Warren County adults, 62 and over, and families. Ten senior housing developments and one family housing development provide a safe environment for residents.



Helping Older Adults Remain Active and Independent

The 741 Center

Offers adults, 50 and over, an array of quality programs and activities to enrich their lives such as SilverSneakers, games, crafts, informational classes, and trips. The Center provides a fun, welcoming, and relaxed atmosphere to enjoy new experiences, make friends, and eat a healthy lunch.

Meals on Wheels™

and Senior Dining Centers

Delivers fresh nutritionally balanced meals to adults, 60 and over, in Warren and Butler Counties. Meals are delivered Monday through Friday to support seniors in order to extend their independence and good health as they age. Prepared fresh daily lunches are also served at several dining centers throughout Warren County.

Supportive Services

Connects adults, 60 and over, to a wide variety of services and assists with applications for benefits such as Medicaid/Medicare, monthly commodity boxes, energy assistance, and home modification grants. Light errands and social visits are available to homebound individuals. Some programs are based on income eligibility.

RSVP Volunteer Program

Utilizes the talents and skills of individuals, 55 and over, to strengthen the community through rewarding volunteer opportunities. Volunteers choose where and when to serve and how much time to give.

Senior Transportation

Offers medical and nonmedical transportation to adults, 60 and over. Medical transportation is provided within Warren County and all surrounding counties. Nonmedical transportation is for groups of 3 or more, picked up from the same location, going to the same destination, typically within Warren County.

Elderly Services Program (ESP)

Provides Intake and Care Management for Warren County adults, 60 and over, who meet eligibility criteria and qualify for services to help them remain independent in their own homes.
