More than 36 million adults in the United States cannot read or write above a third-grade level.

If you like to read and want to help adults improve their reading skills, Adult New Readers needs your help.

We train volunteers to work one-on-one with adults, 18 and over, to teach them to read or to improve their reading skills.

Volunteers attend a 3-hour training workshop. Free training and materials are provided by Adult New Readers. The program also helps legal immigrants learn English as a second language. Tutors may also work with pre-GED, or pre-HSE students, and students studying for the U.S. Citizenship Exam.

DO YOU KNOW SOMEONE WHO WANTS TO IMPROVE THEIR READING, WRITING, OR SPEAKING SKILLS?

Students are screened for their reading level and matched with a trained tutor. They meet weekly in a public place, such as a local library or community building. Students can start in the program at any time and should call us to make an appointment.
