

What is ESP?

The Elderly Services Program (ESP) helps older adults remain safe and independent in their own homes. It provides in-home care for eligible older adults



who might otherwise be forced to leave their homes and enter a nursing facility. **ESP expands care that may already be provided by family and friends.**

Who operates this program?

Council on Aging (COA) manages the program for the Warren County Commissioners. The commissioners appoint a volunteer community board to advise on program needs and policies. Warren County Community Services, Inc. provides intake, eligibility assessment and care management.

Who is eligible?

Services are available to county residents age 60 and older who need help with certain activities of daily living (personal care, housekeeping, cooking, medical transportation, etc.). An ESP care manager determines eligibility for each service during a home visit.

There is no income qualification for ESP, however, clients may have a co-payment for services. More information is available on the back of this brochure.

What help is available through ESP?

A care manager determines eligibility for each service during a home visit.

Adult Day Services: Structured programs provide a secure, stimulating environment for older adults as well as respite for caregivers. Transportation may be available.

Care Management: A professional care manager coordinates services and monitors care.

Consumer Directed Care: Clients can hire their own home care worker who provides services based on the client's care plan. Eligibility determined by ESP care manager.

Electronic Monitoring System: 24-hour, in-home monitoring systems provide safety and/or medication alerts.

Environmental Services: Pest control, major housecleaning and waste removal.

Home Care Assistance: Help with housekeeping, food preparation, personal care, respite for primary caregiver, and other activities.

Home Modifications and Repairs: Minor repairs and safety upgrades such as ramps, grab bars and dead-bolt locks.

Independent Living Assistance: Help with benefit applications and organizing personal and household records.

Meals: Home-delivered meals.

Medical Equipment: Health- or safety-related equipment such as a bath bench, cane, walker or other equipment not covered by insurance.

Medical Transportation: To routine medical appointments within Warren County and bordering counties.

FastTrack Home

FastTrack Home offers older adults quick access to in-home care services as they leave a hospital or nursing home. These temporary services support recovery and help prevent unnecessary return visits to the hospital or nursing home.

FastTrack Home speeds up the normal enrollment process for ESP by determining eligibility before discharge from the facility. This allows services such as homemaking, meals and medical transportation to be in place when the older adult returns home.

Services are provided at no cost on a short-term basis to support a safe recovery. Before the temporary services end, patients receive a full ESP eligibility assessment (including income verification for co-payments) to determine if ESP services should continue.

FastTrack Home is funded by Warren County's senior services levy and managed by Council on Aging. **For more information, call (513) 721-1025 and ask about FastTrack Home.**

Funding and cost

The Elderly Services Program is made possible thanks to the generous support of Warren County taxpayers via a senior services tax levy. Other funding comes from federal and state money, grants, donations and client co-payments.

To help the program serve as many people as possible with the tax dollars available, some clients are required to help pay for the cost of their care through a co-payment. Co-payments are set on a sliding scale depending on income and medical expenses.

There is no charge for meals, but donations are welcomed to help provide meals to more older adults in our area.

Warren County ESP services are funded by a special tax levy. ESP does not supplant care provided by families but rather secures the necessary additional care the family is unable to provide. ESP expects families to take responsibility to care for family members to the fullest extent possible. ESP does not discriminate on the basis of age, gender, race, color, religion (creed), sexual orientation, gender expression or identity, national or ethnic origin (ancestry), marital status, or disability.

How do I apply?

Call **(513) 695-2271** for information and to complete an initial assessment on the phone. If ESP is right for you, a care manager will schedule an in-home visit to confirm eligibility.



If you qualify, your care manager will work with you and your family to arrange for the services that best meet your needs.
